
Abstract Shape Coloring Project


No fill color. Use a stroke only.


Group the shapes together.






Step 2: Create a new overlapping group of shapes.





Step 3: Window > Brushes.


Drag your shapes into the brush palette.



Step 4: Pattern Brush



Step 5: Click OK to go past this palette




Step 6: Select your shapes.

Add the brush you made to these shapes.





Step 7: Example of the applied brush.




Step 8: Scale your shapes larger.

This will change how the brush is applied.




Step 9: Or, Increase the stroke weight to change the design.




Step 10 : Once you are satisfied with your design go to > Object Expand Appearance.

This will allow you to scale your design and not have the brush design change.



Step 11: Scale your design so it completely fills the whole frame. It is OK if it hangs out in the gray areas. Only the white frame will print.

Send your design to the printer.

Step 12: Use colored pencils to finish off your design.

Abstract Color rubric

The deign/s are too basic and do not show evidence of exploring basic options.	There is evidence that the artist created one shape as a skeleton frame for one or both designs.
