Value = The lightness or darkness of a color.

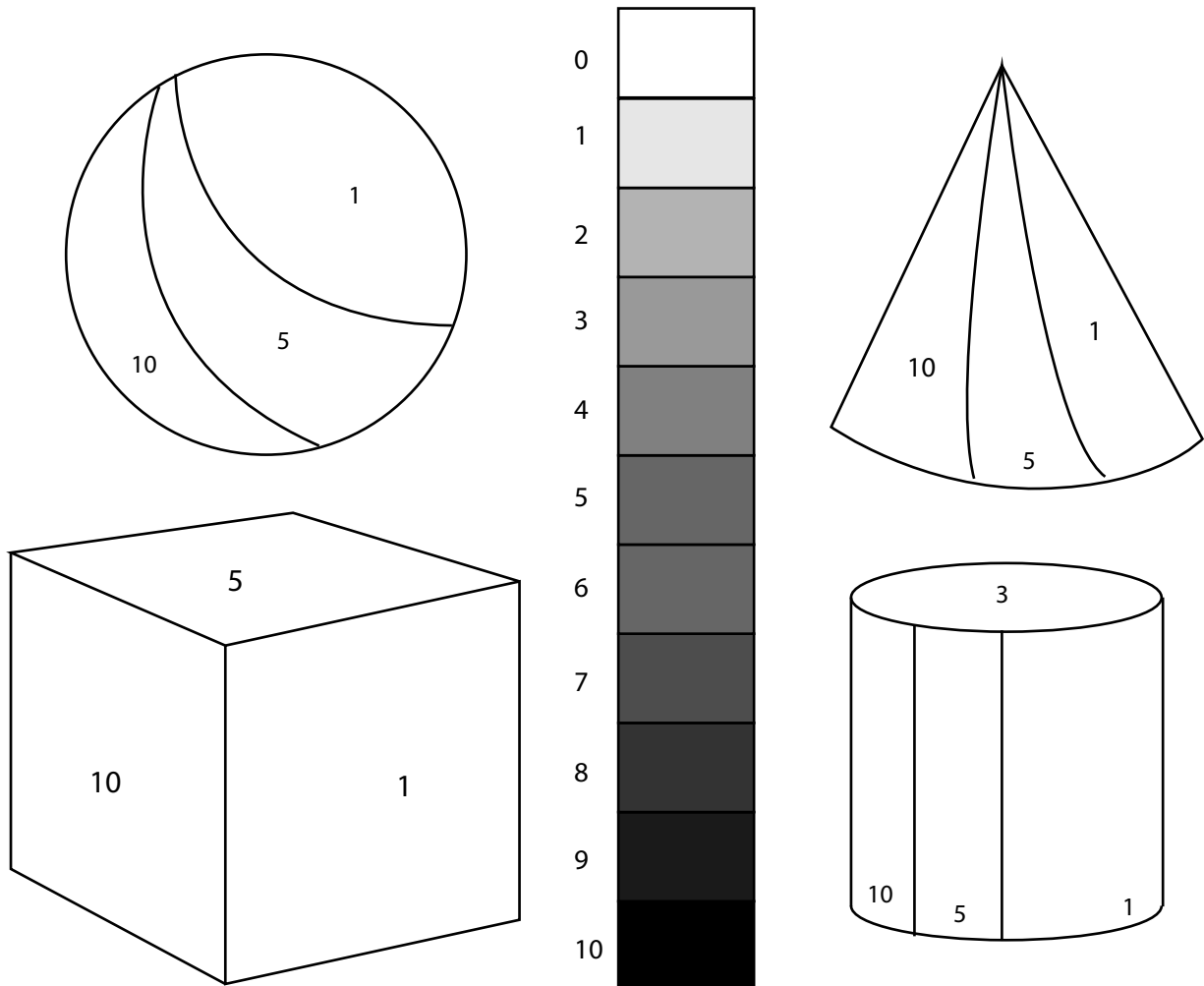
2HB - Yellow pencil is good for light values.

4B - Pencil is good for medium/dark values.

6B - Pencil is good for dark values.

Value is built up in layers! Between each layer you must blend/smooth out the scribble marks. Adjust the pressure on the pencil. The harder the pressure the darker the value.

Value_Stacked Blocks

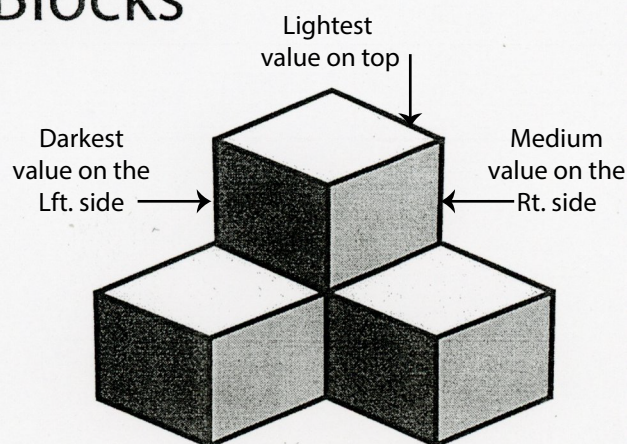
Directions - **Value is the lightness or darkness of a color.**

Use a number 6 value on the left side of each block.

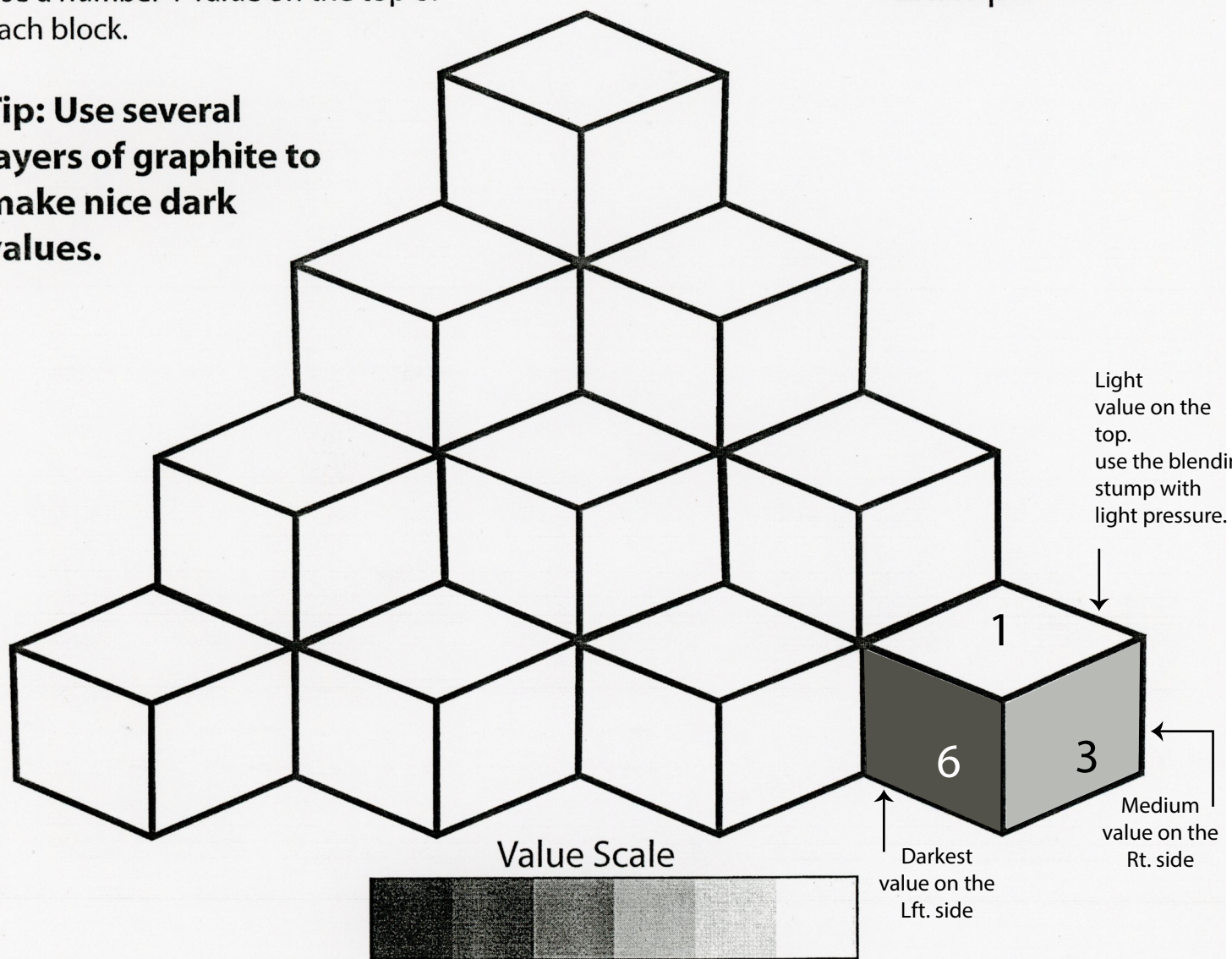
Use a number 3 value on the right side of each block.

Tip: Use several layers of graphite to make nice dark values.



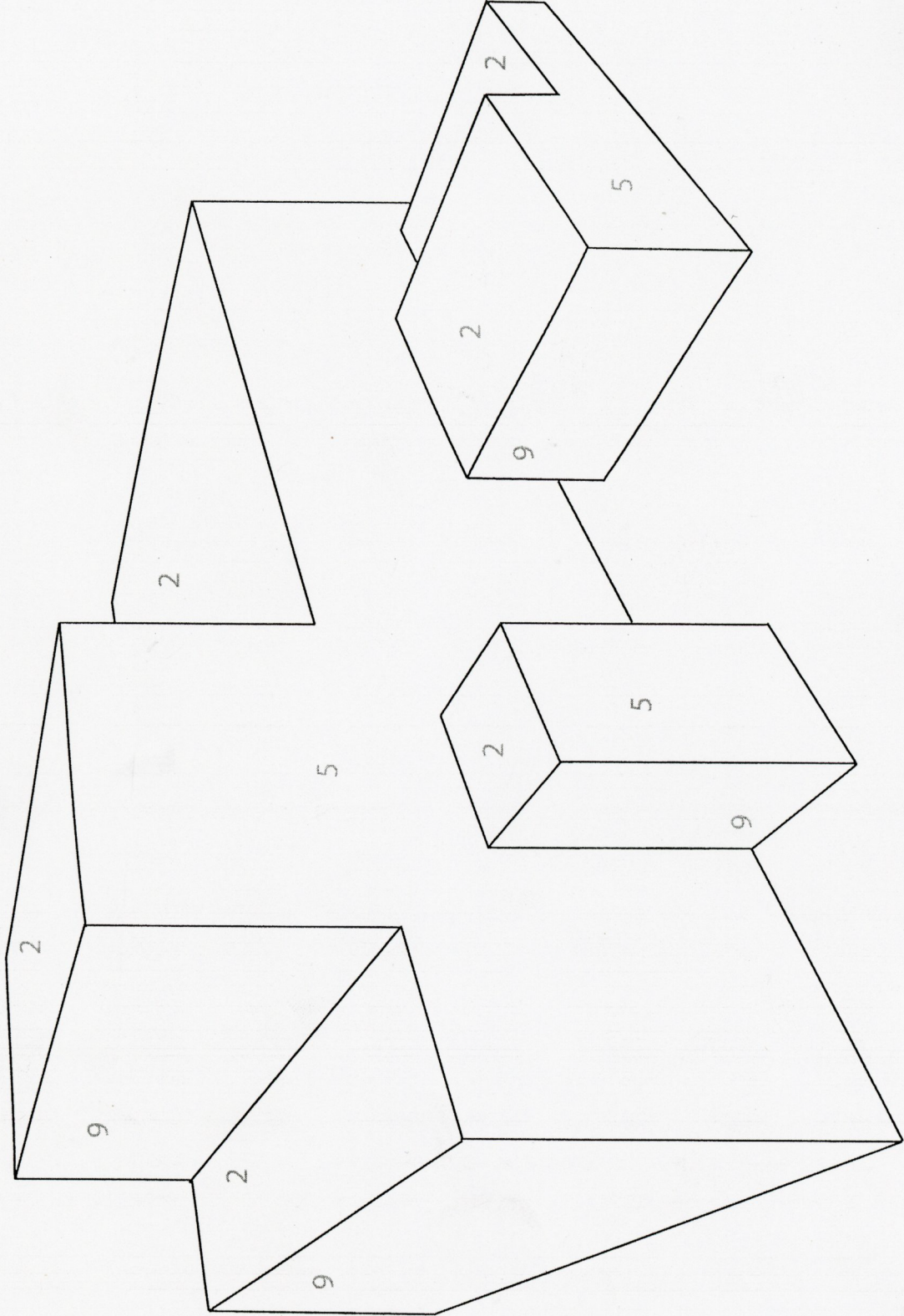

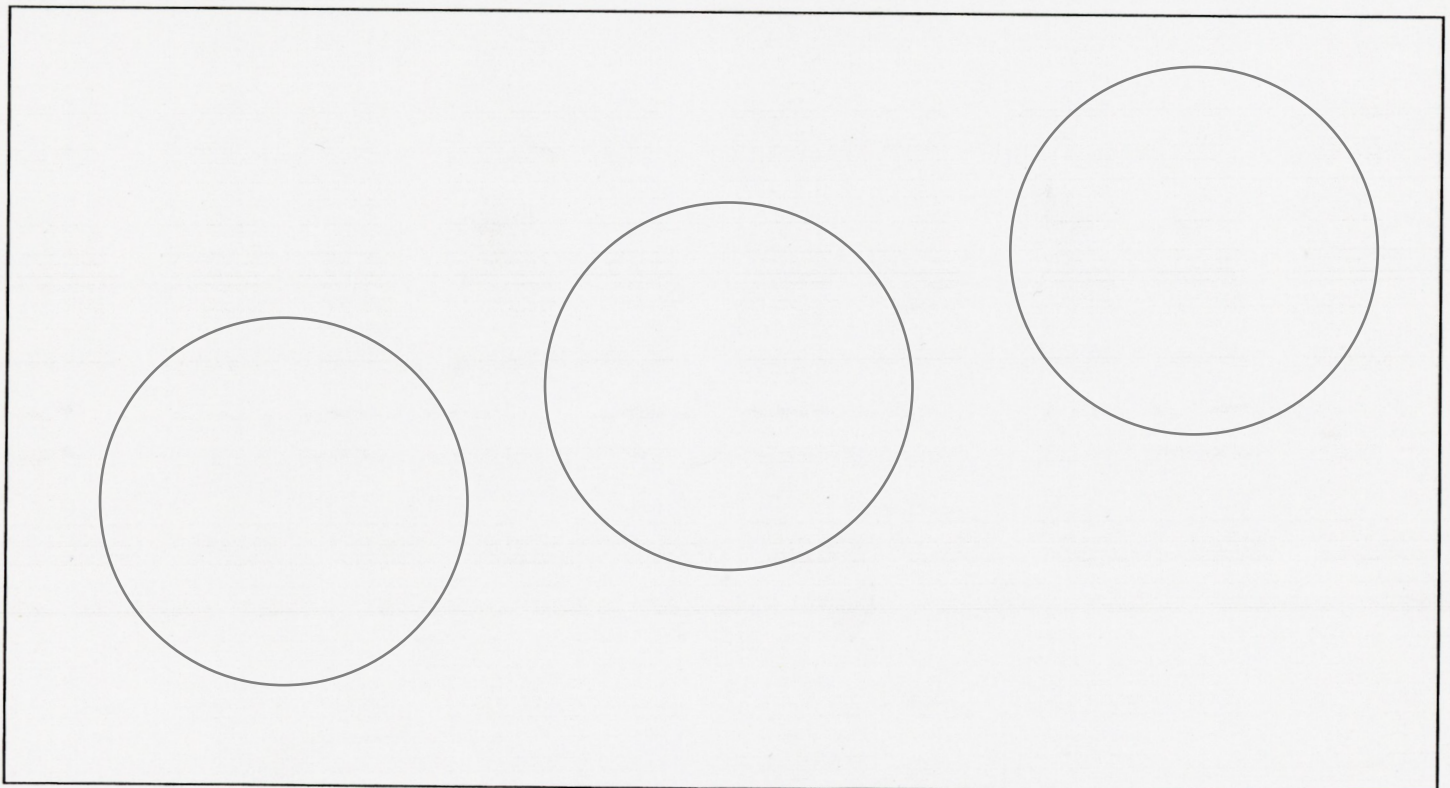

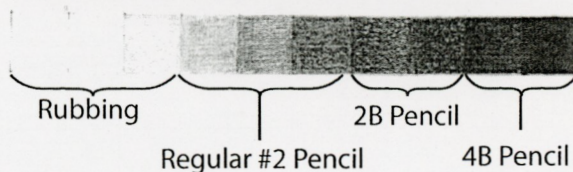
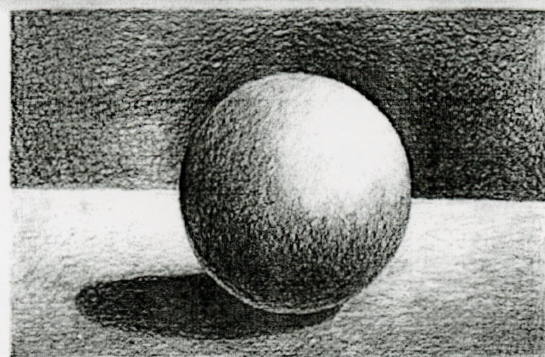


Create value by changing the pressure on your pencils, and / or by building up layers with a variety of strokes in different directions. Draw this example. →
