Intentionally destroying or wasting material

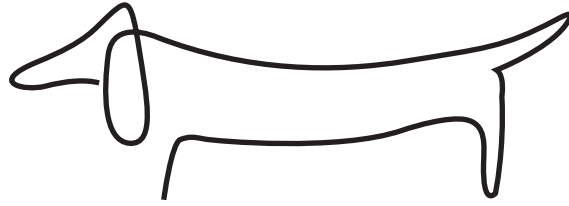
I will consider playful misuse as a serious of offense.

Eye Pokes: Safety glasses can minimize eye pokes, but do not offer 100% security. A rogue strand of thin wire can still whip through a ventilation hole and zap you.

Start out by experimenting with short lengths.

Being hit in the eye with a sharp wire has the potential to cause blindness.

Wire Dog



Materials -
10" of wire
Needle nose pliers

Directions - The pictures below are **ACTUAL SIZE** use each step as a guide to help you know where to bend.



Step 1: Bend the front leg first. Use the diagram to know how far back to bend your wire.



Step 2: Lay the wire on the drawing above to know where to make your bends.

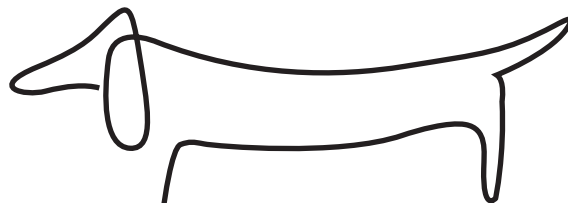
Tip: Position your pliers a little bit behind the actual place you want your wire to bend.



Step 3: Bend the dog's tail.



Step 4: Bend the dog's ear.



Step 5: Finish by bending the dog's head and nose.

If you have extra wire use your pliers to clip it off.
