

Color Wheel_Magazine Pieces

Context- The purpose of this assignment is to introduce students to the color wheel. Students will be focusing on the...

PRIMARY COLORS (red, blue, yellow)

SECONDARY COLORS (purple, green, and orange)

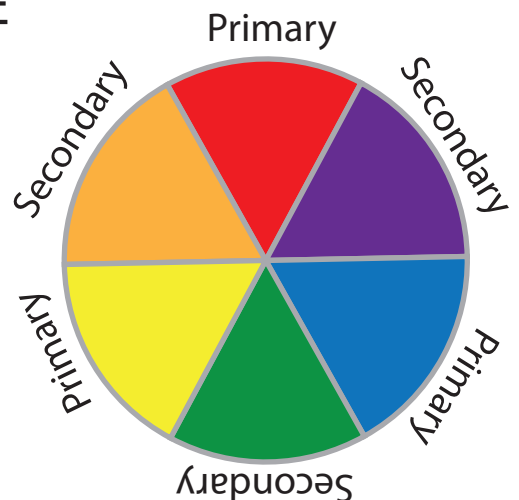
Secondary colors are created when you mix primary colors together. Notice that secondary colors are between primary colors.

Students will also be able to identify COMPLIMENTARY COLORS (color directly across from each other on the color wheel)

RED is complimentary to GREEN

YELLOW is complimentary to PURPLE

BLUE is complimentary to ORANGE



Materials:

8" circle made from cardstock paper

ruler

scissors

pen

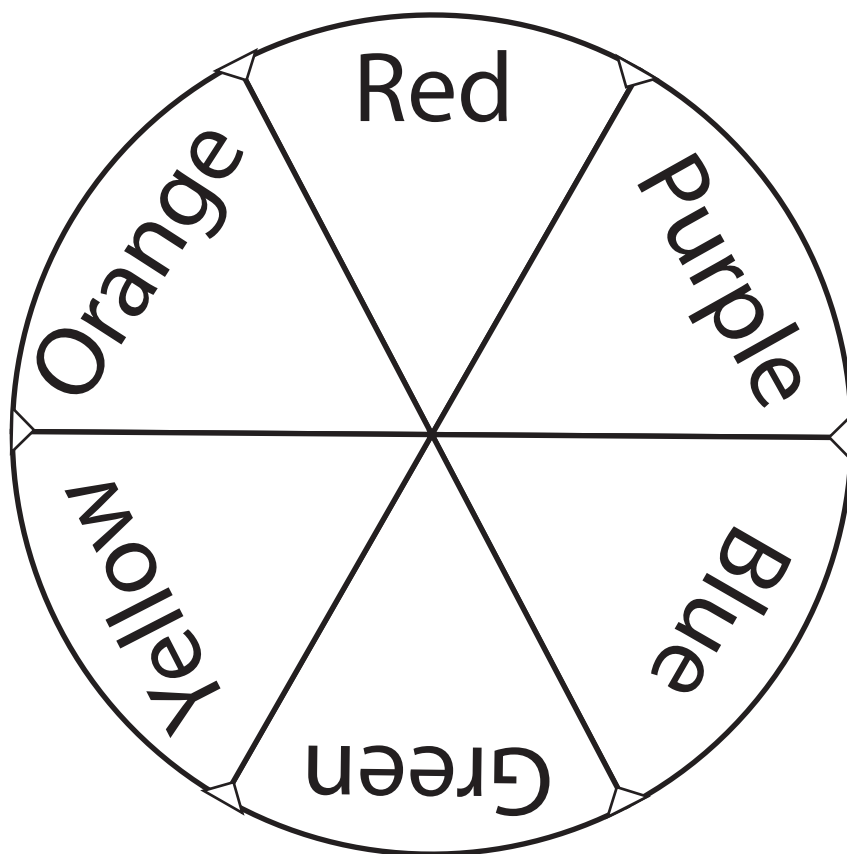
glue

magazines

Step 1: Use the 8" circle template to trace the circle for your color wheel.

Step 2: Use your ruler to draw lines to separate your circle into 6 even pie slices. Use the notches on the color wheel as markers to help you connect the line across your circle.

Label each slice.



Step 3: Write your name on the back of your color wheel.

Step 4: Use colors found in magazines to fill in each slice of your color wheel. Use glue to attach your pieces. Allow colors and textures to overlap. Use a wide variety of each color to fill the slice.

There should be very little white space left on your color wheel!
